By signing this application the sponsor agrees to comply with the following:

- 1. Sponsors must be otherwise eligible to participate in SFSP and properly approved by the State agency in order to participate. Sponsor must be in good standing with SED.
- 2. Approved outdoor sites must comply with the congregate meal requirements on all other days of operation. Requirements pertaining to the number and type of meals that may be served each day continue to apply and sponsors must continue to provide all required components of a reimbursable meal. Because meals served will be consumed off site sponsors should carefully consider all food safety issues and risks.
- Sponsors changing meal times will ensure the following:
 a) Not change meal service times less than 24 hours in advance of the previously scheduled meal service time,

b) Put up a printed notice or poster at the site indicating the change in meal service times to attendees,

c) Alert the community through appropriate channels (such as school or neighborhood listservs), and

d) Comply with any additional requirement(s) requested by the State agency.

4. Sponsors approved for the Non-Congregate Feeding at Outdoor Sites Experiencing Poor Air Quality must submit the attached form to their designated SFSP representative within 10 days

The specific dates on which participants were permitted to take meals off site; and
The number of meals claimed that were taken off site by participants.

- 4. Sponsors should prepare a food safety plan or alternate menu using non-perishable foods specifically for days when non-congregate meal service takes place, to ensure the meal service will be conducted safely.
- 5. Existing site caps must remain.
- 6. Meal times approved by the State for each site must remain.
- 7. No second meals are allowed on days the area is experiencing poor air quality.
- 8. Sponsors must have a plan in place to ensure that meals are distributed only to parents or guardians of eligible children, and that duplicate meals are not distributed to any child.
